



Kagawa University was established in 1949. There are currently six faculties offering courses in Education, Law, Economics, Medicine, Engineering and Agriculture. In addition, these faculties offer opportunities for further studies at the graduate level in Education, Law, Economics, Medicine, Engineering, Agriculture, Management and Kagawa-Ehime Universities' Graduate School of Law. There are about 7,000 students currently enrolled in the university, including an international student body of about 160.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

●Regular courses
Privately financed international students may gain admission into Kagawa University through a special admission channel.

To be considered for admission, students must have completed at least (or are due to do so) 12 years of formal education outside of Japan.

Applicants are also required to take the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) administered by Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO).

The application process starts in August and the entrance examination is administered in late February the following year at Kagawa University.

Students may request for the application form through the mail. Within Japan, a self-addressed, stamped (¥390) envelope (33.2×24.0cm) is required. Outside of Japan, students must provide internationally acceptable stamps sufficient to send 250 grams of documents by airmail. "Request for application form for private students" must be written in red ink and sent to the following address.

●Special auditing courses
Students from universities having exchange programs with Kagawa University may take courses of up to one year. Details can be ascertained through the appropriate section in your university.

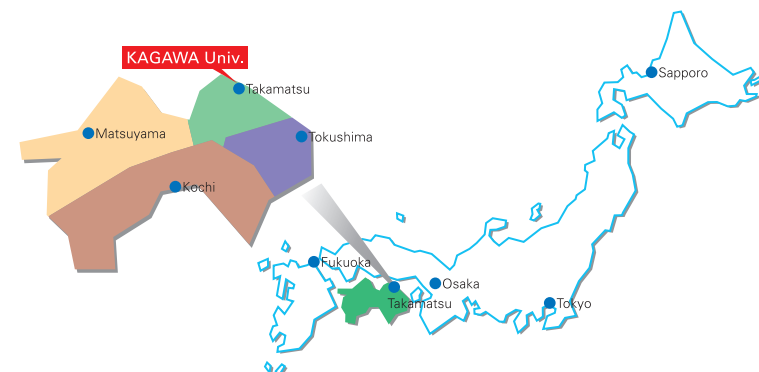
●Non-regular courses (for research students)
Students who have obtained a Bachelor's degree or equivalent may be admitted as research students. Students should contact the faculty concerned for further information on the courses.

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

●Regular courses
Admission procedures including qualification and examinations vary for each graduate school. Please contact the graduate school you wish to enroll in.

●Special auditing courses
Students from universities having exchange programs with Kagawa University may take courses for up to one year. Details can be obtained from the appropriate section in your university.

●Non-regular courses (for research students)
Students who have Master's degree or equivalent may be considered for admission. Candidates are expected to contact each graduate school for the details.

TUITION FEE WAIVER AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Students may apply for the Japanese Government (Monbukagakusho) scholarship prior to arriving at Japan. For further information, please contact Japanese Embassy in your country. In addition, Kagawa University International Foundation offers a monthly stipend of ¥80,000, and an arrival allowance of ¥20,000 for one student, and a monthly stipend of ¥25,000 for six students. Other scholarships offered by local organizations are also available.

International students in regular courses with outstanding academic records and who face financial difficulties may have their tuition fees waived.

HOUSING

●Kagawa University International House

The international house was opened in 1991 and normally accommodates first year international students. It has 32 single rooms and common facilities such as kitchen, laundry room, and shower-bath rooms.

Room fee: ¥5,900 per month (fees for utilities are not included)
Generally a one-year residency is allowed.

●International House at Medical Faculty

The International House was set up near the Medical Campus as a facility for international students in 1999.

The period of residence is 1 year as a general rule.

1 Couple Room 14200yen per month
6 Family Rooms 14200yen per month
(fee for electricity, water and common utility fee are not included)

●Private Apartments

Kagawa University Coop may assist students who wish to live in private apartments near the university. Monthly rent varies from ¥20,000 to ¥60,000 depending on room size and other factors.



●Kagawa Prefecture Housing Support Service for international students

For students who are renting apartments, Kagawa Prefecture International Exchange Association may act as guarantors, shouldering the advance key money and deposits.

*Living expenses in Kagawa average around ¥50,000 per month.
