(1) Characteristics and history

Kagawa University (hereafter, KU) was established in 1949 as a national university. In October 2003, KU merged with Kagawa Medical University to form the new comprehensive 'Kagawa University'.

- (1) Characteristics of the program

Under the individual guidance of a supervisor, students are required to conduct research on the topic which is set individually and complete a report.

- Japanese language education

Preparatory Japanese Language Education (spanning the first six months from October 2024 to March 2025) shall be conducted under the auspices of the Ministry of Education, Sports and Technology. Courses comprising Japanese Language and Japanese Affairs are tailored to match the students' language abilities.

Specialized training

After language training, academic training in the major subject will be conducted for one year.

Students shall receive dedicated supervision from their academic supervisor. In addition, students are welcomed to sit in on any graduate or undergraduate courses that are of interest to them as well as taking part in other aspects of courses, such as field trips and regional exchanges. There are also opportunities for teaching at the faculty's attached, and local, schools from kindergarten to high school level. Students are also encouraged to attend the attached schools' level.
