Course Overview

This course **simulates** the **United Nations**. Each student will be **assigned a country** to represent during the course. The course theme is **conservation of seas and marine resources**. Students (Delegates from each country) will discuss, negotiate, debate, and collaborate with other students to find a fair and effective way to improve marine conservation around the world. At the end of the semester, students will participate in a Model United Nations Exhibition.

Course Goals

Students who take this course will learn and improve presentation, negotiation, debate, and public speaking skills. In addition to these skills, students will become more globally aware of international issues and problems based on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Moreover, students will learn specific terms and vocabulary connected to international diplomacy.

Course Content

The first lesson will serve as an **Orientation Session**. Instructors will inform students **about skills and activities** related to the course, and students will introduce each other.
