Classes for 2020 second quarter

With the state of emergency lifted nationwide on May 25, the coronavirus outbreak situation is slowly improving. However, the situation has not been fully resolved and measures for reducing the risk of spreading diseases is still much needed when taking part in social activities.

At Kagawa University, classes for 2020 second quarter (from June 18 to August 5) will be carried out as follows to continue to provide students with quality education.

Although we are unable to begin all activities as before, we ask for your patience and cooperation.

- 1 Lecture classes (with the exception of classes detail in the following item 2) during second quarter will continue to be offered online.
- 2 Laboratory and practical classes will start being conducted in-person (in a classroom) – upon taking precautionary measures such as avoiding the 3 Cs (closed spaces, crowded places, and close-contact settings) – starting with those of high priority.
(Classes to be conducted in-person)
Classes that will be conducted in-person (laboratory and practical classes, practical skills classes (physical education, music, art, etc.), seminars, graduation research, etc.) will be notified to the student through Dream Campus or WebClass by June 4.
- 3 If a class is conducted in-person, students may use empty classrooms to take online classes on campus. On days when the student does not have in-person classes, students are asked to take their online classes from home to avoid the 3 Cs, unless they do not have the necessary equipment to take classes online.
- 4 Lecture classes are to be conducted online in principle. However, if a class for a certain week involves a laboratory or practical, the teacher may decide to conduct the class in-person. If this is the case, the teacher will notify students through Dream Campus or WebClass and students are to follow the teacher's instructions.

5 Attending in-person classes

- (1) Students are not permitted to come to campus if they have a fever or not feeling well. A special absence will be given who cannot attend their class, and students are asked to contact the administrative group of their faculty for their absence.
- (2) Students must wear masks during class. (For physical education or classes involving physical exercise, masks may be taken off.)
- (3) Take measures for avoiding closed spaces, crowded places, and close-contact settings during class and ventilate the classroom frequently.
- (4) Wash or disinfect hands after class or before eating.

6 Traveling to Kagawa prefecture from a different prefecture to attend in-person classes.

- (1) Avoid traveling between prefectures until the end of May unless absolutely necessary
- (2) If students are planning to attend classes in-person, the student should travel to Kagawa prefecture after June 1.
- (3) However, if students are residing in Hokkaido, Saitama, Chiba, Tokyo, Kanagawa, Kyoto, Osaka, or Hyogo prefecture, students are asked to wait to travel to Kagawa prefecture until after June 9. *

If students come to Kagawa prefecture before June 8, they are asked to stay at home until June 9.

* This date is 14 days from the lift of the state of emergency nation-wide.

- (4) Be mindful of your health condition when traveling. If you are worried about your health after arriving in Kagawa prefecture, please call the Kagawa University Health Center.

7 Final examinations for first semester (second quarter) is planned to be conducted in-person as much as possible, upon taking precautionary measures to avoid the 3 Cs and reduce the risk of spreading disease.

8 Supplementary (make-up) classes may be conducted after August 6.

(Note) Examinations for first quarter

For first quarter, examinations will not be conducted in-person. Instead, students will be assessed on reports, etc. assigned online. Follow instructions from the teacher on assessment.
